Call for Extended Abstract

The Conference Organizing Committee is pleased to invite researchers, academics, practitioners, and students to submit extended abstracts for consideration at the **International Conference on Artificial Intelligence in Sports | ICAIS 2026**.

Submission Guidelines

1. Submissions must present original work that aligns with the conference themes and sub-themes.
2. The extended abstract should not exceed **2-3 pages**.
3. Extended abstracts should be structured to include:
 - Research problem or background
 - Objectives
 - Methodology
 - Key findings or expected outcomes
 - Implications and significance of the study
4. The conference welcomes submissions of:
 - Empirical research studies
 - Theoretical and conceptual papers
 - Literature reviews
 - Ongoing research projects
5. All abstracts must be submitted through the online abstract submission system (link provided below).
6. Abstract must be written in **English** and should not exceed **300 words**.
7. The Conference Organizing Committee reserves the right to reject submissions that do not comply with the stated guidelines and requirements.
8. Submitted abstracts may be subject to plagiarism, similarity, and AI-generated content screening. The conference maintains a strict policy against plagiarism. Any submission found to contain excessive similarity or unethical use of AI-generated content will be rejected.
9. **Submission Deadline:** 25 September 2026.

Key Sections of Extended Abstract

- 1- Title
- 2- Affiliation
*Authors with University/Inst., Country, and email addresses for all [corr. author will have *]*
- 3- Keywords - Max 3
- 4- Abstract - Max 300 words
- 5- Problem Statement and Motivation
e.g., What problem does this work address? Why does it matter in a sports context?



6- Methodology

*Must have **1 block diagram** to explain the work/method. Writing should cover key methods, models, or system design.*

7- Results and Initial Key Findings

***If any results are there**, add main quantitative or qualitative outcomes (a table or chart counts).*

8- Conclusion & Future Work

***Core takeaway and 1 future work** plan based on the current work.*

9- References

Minimum 3 to maximum 6 references [author(s) can reduce font sizes for Ref.].
