The main theme of the 2nd UAEU International Conference on Psychology (ICP 2017) is "Psychology for Today and Tomorrow: Current Issues and Future Directions." There are a wide range of topics under this major theme that will allow participants to contribute to discussions in various research areas. Please see **IMPORTANT DATES** below to submit your paper, workshop and symposia proposals before the deadline.*

The presentation formats are oral presentations, workshops, contributed symposia, and poster presentations.

- **Oral presentations**: individual or co-authored paper. The duration of an oral presentation is 20 minutes, including discussion time.
- **Poster presentations**: individual or co-authored poster. The size of a poster should be no more than 200 cm (height) x 90 cm (width).
- **Symposia**: abstracts from 3 to 5 authors and led by a chair.
 - Should consist of three to five presentations, plus a discussion on a specific topic
 - Duration of symposium is 90 minutes

The organizer of a contributed symposium should first submit a proposal in the form of an abstract describing the purpose and structure of the symposium. The deadline for symposium abstract submission is **OCTOBER 6, 2016**.

Submission guidelines:

- Word limit for presentation titles is 30 words (in English or Arabic).
- Word limit for abstracts is 150 words (in English or Arabic).

IMPORTANT DATES for submission of abstracts:

- * Feedback on abstract acceptance for symposium organizers will be sent by OCTOBER 15, 2016. Feedback on abstract acceptance for oral/poster presenters, symposium speakers and thematic session speakers will be sent by OCTOBER 25, 2016.
- ** You are kindly advised to registrar and pay after the abstracts notification. In order for your presentation to be included in the program you are required to pay the registration fee not later than January 1, 2017.
